Faculty Scholars Program in Integrative Healthcare

Beaumont Health Integrative Medicine is offering a Faculty Scholars Program in Integrative Healthcare. This eight-month, interdisciplinary program is an exploration of theoretical principles, clinical practices, and evidence-based curriculum relating to complementary, holistic, and integrative therapies. This program includes self-study as well as eight classroom days. The in-person days include lecture, Capstone discussions, and a variety of experiential activities all lead by experts in their field. Presenters include physicians, naturopathic doctors, acupuncturists, healthcare administration, and more.

Based on the philosophy behind health promotion, prevention, and whole health, this program teaches models of health and wellbeing and how to integrate these learnings into traditional healthcare. This approach supports patient care when sick as well as prevent illness from occurring. Knowledge gained in the program will help create a culture of health and well-being for both patients and providers.

The Faculty Scholars Program in Integrative Healthcare is open to all healthcare providers including physicians, nurses, OUWB faculty, social workers, psychologists, dietitians, physical therapists, and administrators, and is approved for 65.5 CME hours.

This is a hybrid program. Self-study begins summer of 2022, with the first face-to-face class on September 9, 2022.
